Medicare Retiree Group Participants Receive SmartShopper Mailing in Error

The Medicare-primary population in the State Retiree Health Benefits Program recently received a mailing encouraging them to register for participation in the *SmartShopper* Program. However, since Medicare is the primary payer of their medical claims, this program is not available to them. If agencies that continue to communicate with Medicare retirees enrolled in the State Retiree Health Benefits Program are contacted regarding this brochure, let the recipients know that the mailing was sent in error. They will also receive a letter from Sapphire, who sent the mailing in error, confirming this.

As a reminder, <u>non-Medicare</u> retirees enrolled in the COVA Care Plan or COVA HDHP may participate in the **SmartShopper** program.
