

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS DID YOU KNOW?



- Unemployment insurance benefits provide temporary financial assistance to workers unemployed through no fault of their own and who meet Virginia's eligibility requirements.
- Benefits are paid through state and federal unemployment taxes collected from employers.
- Unemployment benefits are NOT disability benefits. For information about disability benefits visit <u>Virginia Disability Determination Services</u> (DDS).

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

- YOU MUST BE INVOLUNTARILY UNEMPLOYED, FOR EXAMPLE DUE TO A LAYOFF OR FURLOUGH.
- YOU MUST MEET CERTAIN EARNINGS QUALIFICATIONS.
- YOU MUST BE ABLE AND AVAILABLE TO WORK.
- YOU MUST BE ACTIVELY SEEKING EMPLOYMENT.

WHO'S INELIGIBLE?

- Quit your job without good cause.
- Fired for misconduct such as: Falsifying information on your application; failing a drug test; repeatedly late for work.



RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS

If you are unable to work FULL-TIME or without restrictions during the typical or standard hours for the type of work you're seeking, you're NOT eligible for unemployment benefits.

If you can work full-time but are only willing to work from home, you're NOT eligible for unemployment benefits. While you may prefer telework, you must be ready and able to accept non-remote work.

It may take up to 21 days to receive a decision or your first payment.
